- * **Goals:**

- * To build momentum for students to make a seamless transition after high school.
- * To reduce off-ramps for high school students so they feel connected to college before they even graduate.

- * **Class Enrollment:**

- * 25 students in English
- * 35 students in All Other Courses

SDUSD & Mesa Partnership

- * Political Science, English and Mathematics
- * Taught during periods 1-6
- * Taught by Mesa faculty
- * Transferrable college credits

SDUSD Administrative Procedure 4322

Student Participation Criteria

- * School Counselor or site principal/admin review transcript to ensure student is prepared for college coursework
- * Minimum HS GPA of 2.5 or higher
- * Must maintain a 2.0 in college coursework
- * Grades in current classes, and other assessment criteria determines college coursework placement
- * Parent/guardian to review program requirements, sign and collect Student College/University Participation Criteria.

Recommended Student Selection Criteria

Math 96 (& English 47A)

- * 2.5 and above WGPA
- * PSAT scores of 380-470 (Previous 38-47)
- * SAT scores of 380 -420
- * Grades of A/B in courses in English, Math, and Science
- * Students planning on attending a 4 year university
- * Students planning on attending a community college and transferring
- * Students who have passed Intermediate Algebra/Integrated III with an A or B

Poli Sci, Upper Level Math, Eng 101/205

- * 3.0 and above WGPA
- * PSAT scores 500 and above (Previous 50+)
- * SAT scores 500 and above
- * Grades of A/B in Honors courses of English, Math and Science
- * Students planning on attending a 4 year university
- * Students planning on attending a community college and transferring

Monitoring student success is high priority for an assigned site counselor. It is extremely important for one counselor at the site to communicate with the instructor regarding student success. Student failure can severely affect financial aid and college transcripts.

Admission Regulations:

1. Students must have completed the 10th grade.
2. A student may take a maximum of **one course** per college semester. This maximum includes classes at City, Mesa, and Miramar Colleges and ECC (including classes taught on the high school campus or in partnership program). High school students taking college classes on campus are required to pay both the enrollment and health fees.
3. Partnership agreements may have alternative or other specific enrollment guidelines.
4. High school students must satisfy course prerequisites and eligibility requirements. Proof required – contact the college for information.
5. Physical education activity classes will not be permitted for enrollment.
6. The course must be advanced scholastic or technical (college degree applicable). Contact the college Admissions Office for details.
7. Students will be given college credit for all courses. Grades will be part of the student's permanent college record.
8. I have received and read the *Important Facts of Concurrent Enrollment*.

Academic Standing Rules:

1. Students must maintain a 2.0 grade point average each semester in all college work.
2. Students must not receive a W, I and NP in any college semester or the student will be academically

Potential Risks of Enrolling in College Courses while in High School

- * D, F, or Withdrawal grades
- * Low grades can negatively impact high school GPA and could affect 4-year college admission decisions and financial aid eligibility.
- * Students are expected to complete rigorous course work, which may impact time available for extracurricular activities.

The Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) is a general education pattern that fulfills all lower-division general education requirements at all California State University (CSU) campuses and most University of California (UC) campuses/majors. It is also accepted by some private/independent or out of state universities. IGETC is usually recommended for students who intend to transfer to a UC campus, or who are not yet sure of their intended transfer university. Completion of the IGETC pattern is not an admission requirement for transfer to most UC or CSU campuses, nor is it the only way to fulfill the lower division GE requirements of a UC or CSU campus prior to transfer.

Certification: General Education Certification is a legal agreement between the UC or CSU systems and the California Community Colleges that permits a student to transfer from a community college to a UC or CSU campus without the need to complete additional lower division general education courses to satisfy university GE requirements after transfer. Full or partial certification of IGETC is available. Please see a counselor for details.

- Each course must have been IGETC approved at the time it was taken. Courses may be approved for more than one IGETC area. However, each course may be used to certify only one of the areas it is approved for.
- AP credit and coursework completed at accredited U.S. colleges and universities can be used to satisfy many IGETC areas. All such credit must be evaluated through the Evaluations office. Foreign coursework is not acceptable.
- All courses must be passed with a "C" or higher. "C-" is not acceptable.
- Some UC campuses do not allow use of IGETC for students who were previously enrolled at a UC campus.
- Some community college courses have limitations on the amount of credit awarded by the receiving university.
- Students may be eligible for transfer upon completion of the applicable 60 transferable units which must include GE courses. The balance of courses may be preparation for major and/or electives. See a counselor for details.

* Course is listed in more than one area but cannot be certified in more than one area.

+ Transfer credit may be limited by either CSU or UC, or both. Please consult with a counselor for further information.



Important Deadline for Summer 2018: The deadline to submit an application for admission to Summer 2018 and receive a registration date and time is April 26, 2018. Students who file an application for admission after April 26, 2018 will be able to register during the open enrollment period beginning May 29, 2018.

Important Deadline for Fall 2018: The deadline to submit an application for admission to Fall 2018 and receive a registration date and time is June 30, 2018. Students who file an application for admission after June 30, 2018 will be able to register during the open enrollment period beginning August 13, 2018.



Why use my social security number?

- * The use of your social security number is important for the following reasons:
 - * To avoid creating duplicate records. This can create future holds and the inability to locate your transcripts for college
 - * Mandatory for future Financial Aid information
 - * Remember that your record is confidential and information will not be provided over the phone or without proper identification cards.
